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**What does it mean to be an Executive Officer of Stu Gov?**

Being an Executive Officer (Exec) at The Webb Schools means you are an elected representative of the entire student body. To serve effectively in this role requires the Exec's commitment to prioritize leading by example through shaping and embracing the goals, values, and mission of the Webb Schools in words, action, and spirit.

Holding an executive position in student government means the student body has entrusted you with the responsibility to be their voice, and the power to wield it mindfully, respectfully, and effectively. To serve as a Student Government Executive Officer means more than simply leading school assemblies and running Student Government meetings. It means you understand and embody the Four Pillars of Student Government -

- Service
- Advocacy
- Joyful Engagement
- Collaboration

**What are the responsibilities of a Student Government Executive Officer?**

- Train and Lead Student Government Officers and Commissioners
- Serve as a role model for the student body
- Act as an ombudsman
  - for the Student Body to communicate their hopes, wishes, thoughts, and concerns to the deans;
  - for Student Government Officers and Commissioners to communicate goals, ideas, questions, and plans to the deans and the student body.
  - for the deans to communicate information, hopes, feedback, and concerns to the student body.
- Organize and Execute community events
- Inspire and Encourage behavior that aligns with the Four Pillars of Student Government
- Plan, Attend, and Lead
  - Weekly Meetings with the Student Government Advisor(s)
  - Weekly Student Government Meetings
  - Bi-Weekly School Assemblies
- Collaborate with other Heads of Webb Leadership Groups

- No negative campaigning allowed. Candidates in violation of this guideline will likely be disqualified from the election.

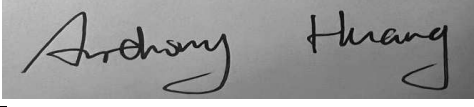
## **Speech Guidelines**

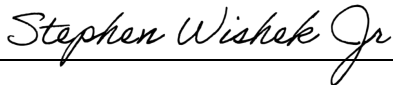
- Focus on goals and vision

- Avoid unrealistic promises (ex. "If you elect me, I will eliminate Lights Out and homework.")

4. According to Warren Bennis, pioneer in the field of modern Leadership Studies, "Leadership is the capacity to translate vision into reality." In 1-2 paragraphs, describe your vision for the 2023-24 school year and how you plan to "translate" it into reality?

In the 2023-24 school year, my vision for Stu gov would be to foster a student-centered leadership group that prioritizes student agency and voice. I envision a Stu gov that emphasizes the development of essential skills such as critical thinking, creativity, respect, and collaboration, as well as the attitude towards dilemmas and, most importantly, to have fun!

To translate this vision into reality, Stu gov may develop a strategic plan that outlines specific objectives, action steps, and timelines for achieving their goals at the start of the year. We may also engage in ongoing communication with the student body to gather feedback and input. Work collaboratively with school administrators and staff to address issues and implement initiatives. This may involve organizing events, programs. We could create an award for the most responsible Stu gov member every month to promote healthy competition in Stu gov. Stu gov can successfully translate goals into reality and positively impact the community by demonstrating leadership skills and maintaining a solid commitment to their vision.

5. Which of the Four Pillars of Stu Gov resonates most with you, your values, your interests, and your goals – Service, Advocacy, Joyful Engagement, or Collaboration? In one paragraph, please explain your connection with this pillar.

Service is the pillar that I believe would resonate with me the most. Service is about engaging in activities that contribute to improving one's community or society as a whole. This could involve volunteering, fundraising, or participating in service projects. Service is important because it promotes empathy, compassion, and a sense of social responsibility. I am a warm-hearted person who enjoys helping the community, which refers to Webb and beyond. As a junior class officer in the Stu gov, I not only participate in activities that all members of Stu gov are involved in, but also collaborate with the other junior class officers in planning theme night, prom, etc. During the process, my goal was always to bring out the best experience for people. I was never tired of brainstorming new ideas if the original one got rejected. I was never frustrated about any confrontation because I believe my job is always to give out all I have to the students. I am also considering collaborating with local non-profit companies for future activities. For example, we could work with sanctuary coffee for catering for large events. This coffee shop would donate 1 pound of food to local people for every cup of coffee sold. In this way, our events help improve the living condition of the larger community. We have many chances to provide good for Webb and the larger community. We simply need a heart that loves to serve.

I believe students desperately want Stu gov to listen to their feedback on various activities, especially for Hoco and prom. People care about those memorable moments in their youth a lot; thus Stu gov should listen better to people's voices. I believe Stu gov should create a anonymous proposal site and put the QR code in front of the Stu gov office. In this way, people wouldn't feel scared or embarrassed to talk to Stu gov members in person.

7. If you were given one school day, a budget of twenty thousand dollars, and complete authority to plan a program for the entire community...
  - a. What would be your goals for the day?

My goals for the day will be to form an entertaining and engaging program that promotes students thoughts on their future. I would like to allow students and teachers to come together to learn new skills and strengthen community bond.

b. What would the agenda/schedule look like?

9:30am: Registration and Welcome

The day would start with a registration and welcome session, where participants would receive a program schedule and an overview of the day's activities.

9:30am - 10:00am: Presentation

A speaker would kick off the day with an inspiring talk that sets the tone for the rest of the program. The speaker would focus on creativity, learning, and community building.

10:00am - 11:20am: Interactive Workshop Session 1

Participants would be able to attend interactive workshops focusing on various simulated occupations such as science, humanity, art, and non-profit jobs. Each workshop would be facilitated by an expert in the field and would provide hands-on interactive learning experiences.

11:20am - 12:40am: Interactive Workshop Session 2

Switch to the next workshop group.

12:40am - 13:30pm: Lunch

Participants would have a break to enjoy lunch at the Price dining hall.

13:30pm - 14:30pm: Community Building Activities

Participants will split into different groups according to their second workshop groups. Participants would come together for community-building activities such as team-building exercises, games, and challenges (eg. Show and Tell, ). These activities would promote collaboration and communication.

14:30pm - 15:30pm: Closing Ceremony and Dessert

The day would end with a closing ceremony, where participants would come together to reflect on their experiences and resolves questions with experts they met in the workshop. It would be an opportunity to reinforce the community building through putting students with similar career interest together.
